# Learning more



#### **F**airies everywhere

There are as many houses in the world as there are fairies. Most of them prefer to live in high places, sheltered from the wind and rain, rather than living close to the ground and in cold, wet zones.

Some city fairies live in church towers, close to the storks, because they can see everything from up there. They also like mouse holes, the cracks in walls and lofts, where they often leave their mark.

In the forest and the jungle, many fairies long to sleep inside perfumed flowers.

Others sleep on large leaves or hammocks built among the reeds. The water fairies prefer to hide behind waterfalls or inside empty snail and sea shells.







## The forest animals...

Just like the fairies, the forest animals also choose different places to live, depending on their characteristics and needs.


#### Houses in the trees

Many birds build their nests in the treetops and some of them spend more time on it than others. Finches use different materials for each of the three layers: Moss and spiders' webs for the outside; more moss and mud for the middle layer; and hair, feathers and wool for the inside. On the other hand, the magpie uses small branches and builds more than one nest in the same tree, although she only lays eggs in one of them. The squirrel also lives in the trees. This rodent makes use of hollows in the trunk and gathers branches to make its home.

#### A hiding place underground

Some animals are natural burrowers and they actually make galleries underground to live. They range from invertebrates, like worms, ants and crickets that live in small holes to mammals, like mice, rabbits and moles. The marmot even covers the exit with hay before hibernating, when the cold weather arrives. You wouldn't dream of waking him up!









## Empathy














Try to understand another person's posture, though you may not agree. Are invaded with the sadness of somebody who is sad. Feel like laughing when a friend is happy.
