Evergreen trees

If you travel further south, you will see huge forests full of trees that are very tall and very resistant to snow. Their leaves look like needles and the trees also have fruit-like structures, called pinecones, full of seeds. These trees remain green all year around. In winter most animals go to places where it is not so cold or spend the whole season hibernating inside a cave or hole until spring comes. They sleep for many months without having to eat.

Other forests change their colors and appearance with each season, since the leaves on their trees fall in winter. In the fall, the leaves change from green to yellow or red, and they finally fall and cover the forest floor. When spring comes, the trees sprout new leaves that grow and the forest floor fills with flowers of all different colors. A big variety of animals live hidden among the trees. In summer they keep busy looking for food, which they store in their nooks or caves, hidden in the ground or among the plants. Most of these animals spend the winter in these forests.



This is definitely the place with the most life diversity on the planet. Jungles form in places where it is always hot, with a lot of rain and plenty of light. Plants and animals are so abundant that many of them are still unknown to man. Some animals' colors are dull for camouflage, while others have bright colors that warn everybody they are dangerous, like some poisonous frogs. There are so many trees, vines and bushes that very little light reaches the ground, which is why some plants grow on trees, wrapping around them and moving up looking for sunlight.
