


4. Cut some teeth out from a piece of white cardboard and stick them into the mouth opening.






Parrot

- 1. Make a sausage and mold the head and tail shapes, narrowing the tail. Flatten a different colored ball on each side of the head.
- 2. Stick on two black balls for the eyes. You can make the beak with two different sized sausages, curved and narrowed at the ends. Flatten and narrow two sausages for the wings. Mark the tail feathers with a toothpick.












1. Make a sausage rounded at the top and flat at the bottom. Join it to a half ball molded into a moon-shape with a toothpick.




2. Secure the join with your fingers. Mold the tip of the tail.







5. To make the legs, cut out two triangles from a sheet of modeling clay and stick them into the body with the help of toothpicks. Also stick some feathers in the tail.

6. To finish off, use a toothpick to mark the toes on the feet and the feather texture.








Ladybird

1. Make two balls, one red and the other black. Cut off the bases and sides of the balls, as shown in the picture.






2. Join the two pieces together with a piece of toothpick.



3. Make some eyes and stick them onto the head. Flatten some black balls to cover the body with spots.





4. Use a toothpick to mark a line along the middle of its back. Open its mouth with a piece of cardboard.

5. A little ball will make the nose. Make the antennae from two pieces of fishing line with little balls at the ends.



6. Cut out six pieces of plastic tube for the legs and stick three into each side. If your ladybird is vain, you can make some eyelashes from small strips of cardboard.
