

DESK ORGANISER

Recommended age: *At least six years old*

Construction level: 😊

Materials:

- Cartons of different sizes
- Corrugated cardboard
- Thick gray cardboard
- Normal card
- Scissors
- Glue
- Double-sided sticky tape
- Paints and paintbrushes
- Sponge
- Ice-cream stick
- Scouring pad
- Toothpicks

HOW DO YOU MAKE IT?

1 Cut the cartons into different sizes and clean them. Make a layout that you like and stick them together with double-sided sticky tape and glue.

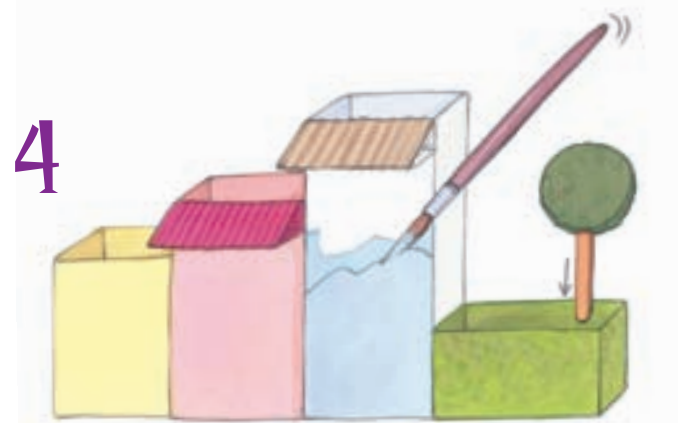


2 To make the roofs, cut out a piece of cardboard and fold it three times to make a triangle, plus a small flap. Stick it as shown in the drawing and fix a rectangle of corrugated cardboard on top using double-sided sticky tape.



3 Make a tree by cutting a circle out of the scouring pad. Insert the ice-cream stick into it with a little glue and leave it to dry.

4 Place some glue behind the stick and fix it onto the lowest carton, which will be the garden. Leave it to dry. Paint the carton with a sponge, using different shades of green. Paint the rest of the cartons and roofs in different colors.



5 For the balconies, do the same as for the roofs, but making four folds. Stick pieces of toothpicks on it to make the railings and paint them in a color that stands out. Paint a window and add some rectangles of corrugated cardboard on the sides.

6 Spread glue on a base made from hard cardboard so that it extends a bit further to look like the pavement. Finish off your organizer with as many details as you like.



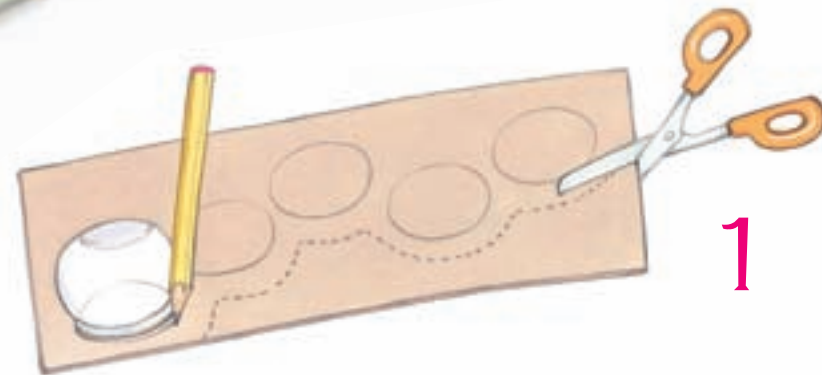

ORGANIZING CATERPILLAR

Recommended age: *At least six years old*

Construction level: 😊



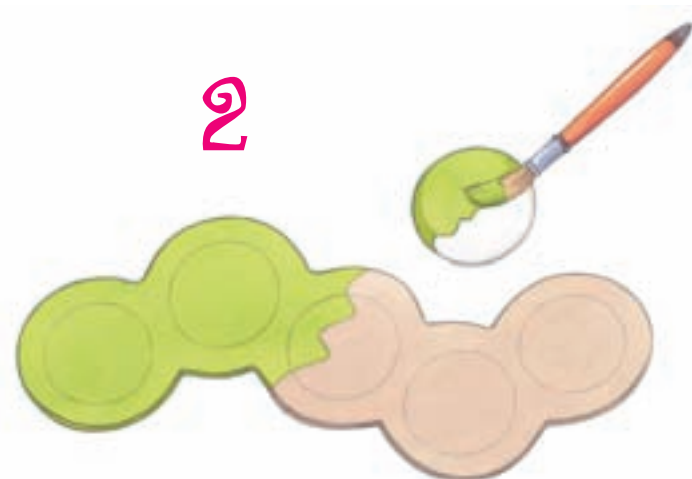

HOW DO YOU MAKE IT?

1 Place a pot top down on the cardboard and mark circles on it, giving it the shape you like for your caterpillar. Cut out the base of the caterpillar, leaving a margin around the circles.

Materials:

- Transparent plastic pots (like yogurt pots)
- A piece of cardboard
- A ball of polystyrene the same diameter as the pot
- Scissors
- A pencil
- Paints and paintbrushes
- Glue
- A black felt-tipped pen
- A pipe cleaner
- A small pompom

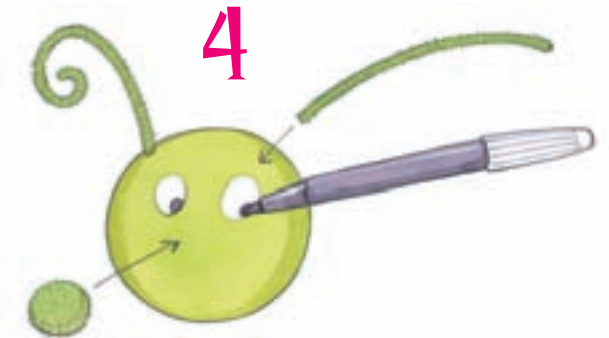
2 Paint the cardboard and the polystyrene ball.

3 Place some glue on the bases of the pots and stick them onto the cardboard.

4 To decorate the head (the ball), paint some eyes with white paint and a felt-tipped pen. Stick on the pompom, which will be the nose. Make some amusing antennae from the pipe cleaner.

T-SHIRT FOLDER

Recommended age: *At least six years old*

Construction level: 😊

HOW DO YOU MAKE IT?

1 Draw on the cardboard a rectangle the same size as a folded t-shirt. At the top, add the outline of a head. Cut it out.

2 Paint it as you like.

3 Cover the rectangle with the adhesive transparent film (on both sides) so that the clothes will slide off better.

How to fold t-shirts.

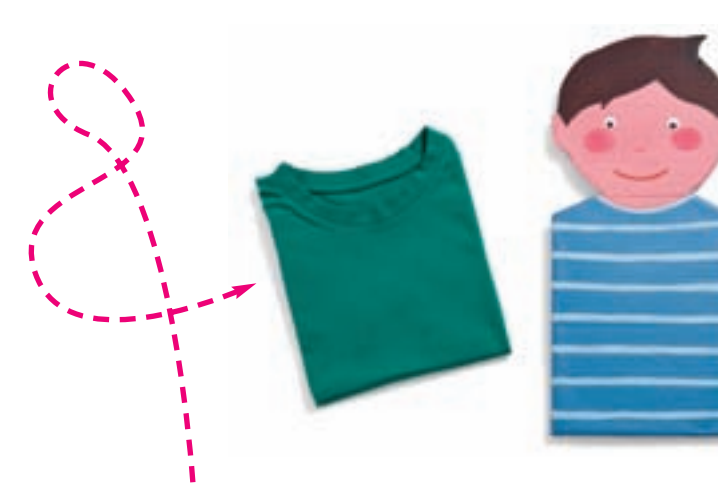
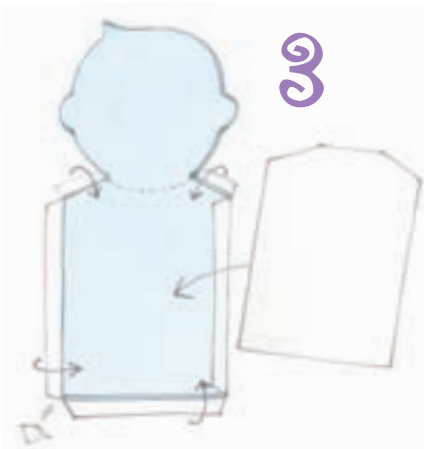
1 Spread the t-shirt face down on a flat surface. Place your cardboard on top, so that the necks line up.

2 Fold one side into the center.

3 If the sleeve is long, fold it again downwards as shown in the drawing.

Materials:

- Cardboard
- Pencil and ruler
- Scissors for cutting cardboard
- Paints, paintbrushes and small dishes
- Adhesive transparent film



4 Fold the other side in the same way.

5 Now fold the lower part upwards.

You will see that with very little effort, your t-shirts will be well folded and you will be able to put them on without any creases.



6 Remove the cardboard carefully. Now it's ready to be put away!
